LESSON 9

Planning our television news report

LESSON DURATION

Students may require a minimum of 120 minutes to complete this task.

Lesson duration is dependent on the method of presentation student groups decide to adopt. The lesson duration is at the teacher's discretion.

LESSON VENUE

Classroom

STUDENT PRIOR KNOWLEDGE

Students will need to be aware of behaviours that make a good presentation to an audience, such as positive body language, making eye contact, speaking clearly and appropriate use of notes.

They should also have prior knowledge of PowerPoint or Keynote to present their work and (or) video or audio software to edit film and audio.

WALT - WE ARE LEARNING TO...

Prepare for the presentation of our television news report.

WILF - WHAT I'M LOOKING FOR...

- I can use match day media to evaluate the performance of a team.
- I can use press conference information to build an awareness of a club and country.
- I can produce an engaging television news report using descriptive visual and (or) written text.

PLANNING OUR TELEVISION NEWS REPORT

LESSON DELIVERY

The following provides you with a suggested plan on how to deliver this lesson. You are encouraged to take a flexible approach and modify this lesson and its timings to suit the needs and abilities of your students.

1. Preparing to present work to an audience (10 minutes)

Explain to students that soon they will be participating in an event where they will present their television news reports to an audience.

Teachers and students should collaborate when deciding who the audience will be. The audience may be invited to the school or reached online and (or) through the use of media. See [Students modelling skills learnt](#) for examples of the audience and ways in which it can be reached.

For live presentations teachers and students should inform the targeted audience well in advance of presentations to ensure a healthy attendance. [Templates to promote your event](#) publicising your event and [Information and Communication Technology \(ICT\), media and social media opportunities](#) are provided with this unit to assist with promotion.

2. Revisit previous learning (5 minutes)

For the ***This is Jets News*** unit students, in their teams, were asked to produce a television news report on a club participating in an Asian tournament hosted by **Newcastle Jets** in Australia.

In Lessons 1-4 they collated football and non football related information about their assigned club and country by participating in a press conference activity. In Lessons 5-7 they gathered information about the football performance of the club and country working as media crews covering a football tournament.

Now it is time for them to compile their work.

3. Group planning (5 minutes)

Using relevant information collated, student teams are to produce a television news report on the club and country that they have been assigned.

The television news report will consist of the following story elements:

| STORY ELEMENT | DESCRIPTION |
|-----------------------------------|--|
| THE TEAM | A profile of the football team, using player interview information, photos, film footage and match report data captured in the football game activity. |
| THE COUNTRY | Highlighting the information, as told to them in the press conference activity, such as culture, language, food, geography and climate. |
| TELEVISION NEWS REPORT PRODUCTION | Produce the news segment, including written content, developing the format and directing the segment. |

Team presentations should be coordinated as a group. Each member of the group however is responsible for researching and presenting a part of their presentation.

4. The television news report - what it should look like (10 minutes)

Students should make their television news report highly visual with the use of images, drawings, collage work, graphics or film to communicate their message.

Images, film and audio captured during the press conference and football activities could provide creative visual or audio elements for the report.

The length of student presentations is at your discretion. It will largely be dependent on the method of presentations students choose. It is recommended that the duration of presentations be between 3-5 minutes.

Students can use a range of methods and styles to present their work, examples include:

- Role play of a live television news panel show
- Poster presentation
- Pre-recorded video news report
- Presentation with a mix of visual and oral elements, for example, multimedia, film, art and graphic design and public speaking
- PowerPoint or Keynote presentation with an embedded video, audio and images (optional).

5. Doing the work (duration at the discretion of teachers)

Distribute Activity sheet 9.1 - This is our plan - hard copy to each group or interactive pdf version on student computers, laptops or iPads.

Before students start their presentations, they should use Activity sheet 9.1 - This is our plan to decide the following:

- Presentation style and method
- Roles and responsibilities of each team member
- Duration of their presentation
- Materials and equipment needed.

Once students have completed this task, they will need to discuss their plans with you. Once confirmed they can get started.

With students working together in a team, you are provided with the perfect opportunity to recognise and validate positive and inclusive behaviours.
